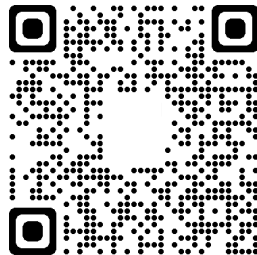
Youth Group— Wednesdays from 6:30-8:15pm.
