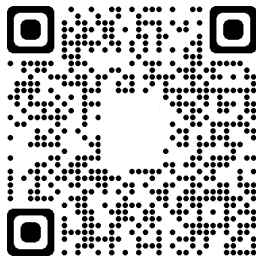
Youth Group— Christmas Party: Wednesday at 6:30pm
